Thank you to my colleagues who attended marches on Wednesday, who continue to send valid and vital messages that go unheard. You retain your passion for Teaching and your dedication towards getting the best for our tamariki. Your efforts are appreciated.

I have borrowed the words of my good friend and colleague George Barry from Hokitika who still has the energy to write...

'Our Government are naive to the complexities, which exist in every classroom throughout Aotearoa. Ignorant at the sheer multi-faceted levels of learning, behavioural, emotional, social, self-regulatory, sensory (I could go on) needs of the students that every dedicated teacher faces day in, day out. Teachers possess special personality traits that instil them with determination, patience, motivation, self-preservation, empathy, calmness, humour, kindness, intuition, enthusiasm, imagination, creativity, perseverance, tolerance, understanding and wisdom. Taking advantage of these qualities by failing to provide such an amazing workforce with adequate funding, resources and time, insults their integrity, morality and selfefficacy. Over time, this has led members of our professional body to feel devalued, demoralised, demotivated, dejected, despondent, disappointed, discouraged and disenfranchised. This is simply NOT good enough. Teachers need to hear a genuine acknowledgement of their crisis from this Government, they need hope, something that reassures them that some positive changes are being planned for....right now. Changes that will begin to address the daily challenges they face and changes that acknowledge the quandary they exist in, when seeking to do good in the face of adversity. Changes that combat their struggle to successfully function and thrive, in an inherently flawed system, that requires them to perform and accomplish, whilst undertaking overly demanding roles, duties and responsibilities within an education system that is clearly in a dilemma. Whilst the Government are inevitably 'hearing' about which issues need to be resolved, they are simply not actively listening, understanding or caring.....there is no evidence in anything that they have offered or announced, to contradict this.....it is time for this apathy to end.....for the sake of our profession, our tamariki, their whanau and our society.'
