#### PRINCIPALS REPORT

I hope you all enjoyed your long weekend. It was great to hear reports from our young leaders who had a great day in Dunedin last Friday. Ollie, Jacob, Carly and Kyle were very fortunate to attend this event.

One of the key messages picked up by Paulette at some PD during the week was for both children and parents to be 'present' for each other. I have been trying to be more mindful of this both at home and at work. Everyone's time is important and as parents, we need to make time to engage fully with our family and give them our full attention.

Modern technology is great but face to face interactions without distractions will make us feel more valued. Thanks Paulette for this valuable reminder.

This past couple of weeks I have been observing oral language and shared reading lessons in classes. It was great to see examples of Teachers actively teaching children the skills of asking open-ended questions, having 'thick and thin' conversations, whole body listening skills, extending vocabulary and teaching values (honesty) through buddy sharing of their own experience in response to a video clip. In many classes, the Teachers and Students were making the most of their Chromebooks and screens as tools for learning. You really are so lucky with the quality of teaching your children are getting. Keep in mind (when we are striking) that a 15-minute oral language lesson can take over an hour to plan and resource.

This has been a very short week with a long weekend and the Teacher Only Day tacked on to that. We spent the day with all staff from the Fiordland and Northern Southland Schools taking part in various workshops to do with implementing digital technology into the curriculum among other things. It was great to talk with other school leaders and reassuring to know that we are well along this journey and will be well prepared to implement the new curriculum in 2020.

Yesterday all the staff started training with our new software for our student management system 'MUSAC' Edge. This is an exciting new development and will result in smoother recording and sharing of student information electronically. Eventually, you will be asked to download the new app and will have access to the parent portal where you can see notices and reports for your child/children. Those of you who have children with St Peters will be familiar with the system.

Huge thanks to the Eaton family/Willow Lodge contracting and Grevillia Agriculture NZ for the generous donation to our school. Our community really looks after us and we are very fortunate.
